

Davson – World Leaders & Enlightenment

Presented by the Days of Good Hope Art Trust and 48 Hours toward World Peace, this exhibition of 50 works includes etchings, silk-screen prints, drawings and paintings by Sharon Davson.

For almost two decades, Sharon Davson's exceptional art and charity work have been embraced by world leaders from many fields including: Sir Cliff Richard, Andre Agassi, Neil Diamond, Mario Andretti, Sir Nigel Mansell, Paul Newman, Cathy Freeman and Bon Jovi.

The *Davson - World Leaders & Enlightenment* is a major survey exhibition containing many of the most acclaimed works from 1973 to 2006, encapsulating unique and definitive collections of Davson's personal globalism.

They celebrate the work of this internationally acknowledged Australian artist, and are a visual expression of her care and concern for all inhabitants of our planet and its environment. On viewing these works, it is easy to understand why Davson is known as the artist world leaders follow.
